OUR VISION:

Our Vision is a world in which people who have intellectual disabilities are fully included in all areas of our community and are recognized for their potential, their talents, and their contributions to society.

OUR MISSION:

OSBI provides dynamic programs to individuals who have Intellectual Disability and their families to achieve full participation in their community.

OUR CORE VALUES:

• RESPECT AND DIGNITY: People who have Intellectual Disability are fully included citizens of our community and deserve to be treated as such.

• PERSONAL CHOICE: Personal choice is a human right, and people who have Intellectual Disability must have a controlling voice in defining their current and future goals for achieving an enriching and meaningful life.

• INDEPENDENCE: People who have Intellectual Disability must have access to opportunities for continuous personal development to attain skills, to achieve the ability to support themselves through meaningful employment, to access community resources, and to live in a residence of their choice that is affordable and meets their needs for support.

• INCLUSION AND ACCESS TO COMMUNITY RESOURCES: People who have Intellectual Disability are citizens of our community and deserve access to all the resources that any member of the community has – employment training and placement, fair wages for work performance, public transportation, fitness and arts opportunities, health and mental health care services, and financial aid when needed.

• PERSONAL RELATIONSHIPS AND SOCIAL NETWORKS: "No man [or woman] is an island." People who have Intellectual Disability cannot be relegated to isolation in a family home or public housing without access to opportunities to be with peers, form friendships, and enjoy the fulfillment that comes with enriching relationships.

• PARTNERSHIP: It takes a "Village" to address the needs of vulnerable populations in our community. We recognize that we cannot achieve our Mission alone. We must work with partners in local businesses, governmental bodies, community service organizations, agencies with aligned missions, and other civic entities to open doors of opportunity to people who have Intellectual Disability.

• COMMUNITY AWARENESS: People who have Intellectual Disability have for too long been seen as a subculture of our community, sequestered in protective but isolating programs. They are no longer to be seen as the recipients of charity, but as fully participating contributors to our community. Their abilities rather than their disabilities must be showcased and acknowledged.

A LETTER FROM OUR C.E.O. & BOARD CHAIR



We first wrote this Annual Report letter earlier this year in February 2020. Now, as we are about to go to print, we realize we have to write a very different letter. We know we are stating the obvious when we say that the world has changed for all of us and, of course, for One Step Beyond as well. 2019 was an amazing year for One Step Beyond. We opened a new campus in Scottsdale and were poised

to offer our programs to a population of young adults newly graduating from High School Transition Programs in the East Valley. We had secured a new center in San Carlos, CA, with a projected opening of January 2020. We were at last making true progress on a plan for a residential program for several of our participants and their families who are so ready to take this next step in their goals of independent living. Our CA hockey team sponsored by the San Jose Sharks flew to AZ to scrimmage against our AZ Coyote sponsored team at the 2019 Cactus Cup. Our One Step Catering Company had its best year ever, almost doubling our 2018 business opportunities and employment for our Culinary Academy graduates. 100 of our participants had achieved their goals of paid employment. Yes, indeed, 2019 was a great year, and 2020 looked full of promise. Life in the reality of COVID-19, presents significant challenges to how we will provide the programs and services our participants and their families need, deserve, and expect of One Step Beyond. In California, we have been sheltered in place since early March. In AZ, we were considered an essential service, so we have kept a small center-based program going. In both states, we quickly developed virtual programming for our participants so that they would not feel isolated from friends and staff and continue to work on their personal developmental goals. It is hard to know what the future will bring, but we are as committed to our Mission as ever. "There are Special Needs everywhere; and where there are Special Needs, One Step needs to be there." (Co-Founder, Joseph Rogers, 15-Year Celebration). As we begin our 18th year of service to people who have Intellectual Disability, we appreciate all of you who have supported us this year and those of you who have supported us year after year. We will get through this because of you.



GROWTH BEYOND EXPECTATION

In 2019, we experienced growth throughout all areas of OSBI; empowering our organization to serve more individuals and families who need our services!

- Our Scottsdale location held its grand opening! Our new location provides **14,000** square feet and **5** new program spaces which will eventually serve **200** new OSBI participants.
- We received a generous grant of **\$150,000** from the Del E. Webb Foundation to remodel our culinary building with a commercial kitchen.
- OSBI California expanded its San Carlos Campus, to include more space for current and future participants.
- The OSBI Transportation Program provided rides, to and from, home to program, for **509** of our participants across Maricopa County in AZ, and to **38** participants in San Mateo County.
- Our inaugural H.U.G. Campaign raised \$87,236 dollars. This annual campaign Helped Us Grow, providing new opportunities for our participants!

























THE PROGRAMS

LIFE SKILLS VOCATIONAL TRAINING & JOB PLACEMENT CULINARY TRAINING COMMUNITY BASED PROGRAMS RECREATION & FINE ARTS HEALTH & FITNESS ICE HOCKEY



CULINARY PROGRAM

ICE HOCKEY PROGRAM

engages over 70 team-members in two states and is still growing. In CA we are proud to be The One Step Sharks, and in Arizona we are The One Step Coyotes.

HEALTH & FITNESS

offers the opportunity to participate in team sports through Special Olympics, to workout with a personal trainer, to meet personal health goals, obtain a gym membership, and work out in the community with peers and OSBI staff.

VOCATIONAL PROGRAM

provides job-readiness training and opportunities for both volunteer and paid work in community settings. Our community partnerships strengthen our goals of inclusion and meaningful employment for our participants.

LIFE SKILLS PROGRAM

prepares participants to accomplish their personal developmental goals. Our variety of classes and opportunities promote socialization and independence.

RECREATION PROGRAM

offers multiple levels of learning and showcase opportunities in Music, Fine Arts, and Dance, as well as social outings on nights and weekends that promote community experience and inclusion.

CALIFORNIA COMMUNITY-BASED PROGRAMS

help participants learn and gain access to resources in their community while focusing on teaching independent living, social communication, safety, and jobreadiness skills.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS OF 2019 HERE'S WHAT WE WERE UP TO!

Culinary Program

Our Culinary Department provided catered meals at events all over Phoenix, including The Legislative Awareness Day at the Capitol, serving a full meal for 800 community members. \$14,000 was also raised during 3 special events organized and catered by our OSBI Culinary Academy Chefs.

Life Skills Program

In Arizona and California our Life-Skills Programs allowed 600 plus participants to make steady progress toward their personal goals of independence. In addition, 16 of these participants attended courses in their local community colleges.

Community-Based Programs

With a generous grant from the City of San Carlos, our groups learned how to access public transportation and **50** individuals rode the Caltrain to a San Francisco Giants baseball game at AT&T Park.

Recreation Program

We answered the call for more recreation opportunities with the addition of 16 new classes. The Annual Trip consisted of 3 large charter buses, 100 participants, 32 staff members, 2 nights, 3 days and a ton of fun at Camp Pinerock in Prescott, AZ.

Health & Fitness Programs

Over 95 participants enjoyed working out in the community at our partnered gyms. The YMCA and Rio Vista Recreation Center. Over 280 participants engaged in the Personal Fit Program and reached their individual fitness goals.

Fine Arts Program

The Art Program participated in wonderful community art showcases and events. Among them was Phoenix Fan Fusion. WHAM Art gallery exhibits, and Painting with Holiday Helpers, Check out their Instagram page at OSBIFineArts to see their talented artwork!

Employment Program

In California, we launched our Community-Based Work Programs, placing 2 individuals in paid internships and 1 individual in independent paid employment, as well as contribututing 1,200 volunteer hours to local San Mateo nonprofits. In Arizona, the Vocational Program added 4 new community partnerships, employing 11 OSBI participants, and the Pre-Vocational Program added 6 new partnerships employing 29 participant volunteers. Participant volunteers provided over 13,500 community service hours to local Arizona nonprofits.

Ice Hockey Program

The OSBI Hockey Program has been steadily growing with the support from **2** NHL franchises, The San Jose Sharks and The Arizona Coyotes. Currently, the program not only provides hockey to approx. **70** OSBI team members, but the local Arizona rink also provides jobs to some of our Vocational Program members. 7
